

## Oakville Suzuki Performing Arts Camp – Student Leader Program Information

All applications received by **May 1<sup>th</sup>** will be reviewed. Leader positions will be offered based both on quality of application and camp requirements. All candidates not offered a position as a Leader are encouraged to attend camp in the Chamber program. Applications received after May 1st will only be considered if any positions remain.

An email response will be sent to all applicants on or before May 15th. At that time all students accepted must confirm their position by going back to the on-line registration system and proceeding to the shopping cart check out. (allowing for payment)

- Attend set-up session - dates to be announced - including Saturday, July 2nd at St. Mildred's Lightbourn School
- Clean up on the Friday afternoon (s) that you are working once camp is over
- Accept assigned responsibilities and carry out duties completely and to your very best ability
- Share your love of music!
